

**INSTRUCTIONS FOR A DIALECTICAL JOURNAL - PART ONE  
(SECOND PROJECT FOR ADVANCED STUDENTS/OPTIONAL PROJECT FOR REGULAR STUDENTS)**

- Step 1. Write your name, the title of the book, and the author in the first column. You will more than likely need additional journal pages.
- Step 2. Write a quote from the book in the **Quotation** column.
- Step 3. Write the page number of the quote in the **Page #** column.
- Step 4. Write a response to the quote in the **Your Response to the Quotation** column. You want to share why you find the quote interesting or why you see it as being important. Your responses could begin with phrases such as: *I wonder... I feel... This character reminds me of... I predict...*  
**Respond to a minimum of 10 quotes from the novel.**
